Third Country Antidumping/Countervailing Duty Actions

- Working with foreign co-counsel in anticipation of a prospective case to ensure that a U.S. company has a fair opportunity to participate.

Additionally, we have a close working relationship with officials at the U.S. Department of Commerce with whom we coordinate on trade remedy actions brought by foreign governments to ensure that the proceeding is in compliance with World Trade Organization obligations.
